**Robert Sinclair - Canadian Ambassador to Sweden:** Over the past weeks, I have had the privilege of meeting with several key Swedish partners as we continue to advance our collaboration under the Canada–Sweden Strategic Partnership.

My discussions with Minister for Defence Pål Jonson; Peter Hultqvist, Chair of the Parliamentary Committee on Defence; Mikael Granholm, Director-General FMV - Försvarets materielverk; and Jens Mattsson, Director-General FOI; focused on our shared priorities: Arctic security, technological resilience, and our unwavering commitment to supporting Ukraine. It was also a pleasure to discuss export controls and investment screening with Carl Johan Wieslander, Director-General ISP Inspektionen för strategiska produkter.

I appreciated the opportunity to learn more about Sweden’s approach to civil preparedness and resilience in meetings with Minister for Civil Defence Carl-Oskar Bohlin; Mikael Frisell, Director General of the Swedish Civil Defence and Resilience Agency; and Johan Berggren, State Secretary to the Minister for Civil Defence. Canada and Sweden share a deep interest in strengthening societal resilience in an increasingly complex security environment.

It was encouraging to see the recent increase in high-level Swedish visits to Canada, including by Mikael Frisell, Jens Mattson, and Johan Berggren—a clear sign of our growing partnership. It is also exciting to see the positive momentum in Canada–Sweden defence industrial and commercial cooperation, reflecting growing alignment between our industries and long-term capability needs.

I was also pleased to visit the Nordic Centre for Gender in Military Operations (NCGM) for Gender in Military Operations, where Canada has been a committed partner since 2017. The Women, Peace and Security agenda is more important than ever as we confront global threats such as technology-enabled violence, disinformation, and climate-related insecurity.

Canada and Sweden are natural partners in security and defence, and I look forward to building on this momentum as we continue strengthening our cooperation.
